Describe the proposed changes to the program as well as the rationale for making the specific changes and include any relevant supporting data

The School for Global Studies (SGS) proposes a substantial change to the Bachelor of Arts in Global Studies. Currently, SGS offers seven Bachelor of Arts degrees: Arabic, Gender and Women's Studies (GWS), Global Studies, Judaic Studies, Latin American Studies (LAS), Middle Eastern and North African Studies (MENAS), and Human Rights Practice (Arizona Online). To ensure the vitality of existing SGS program faculty and course offerings and satisfy enrollment minimums, we propose retaining the Arabic and Global Studies majors while offering new emphases within the redesigned Global Studies BA that align with program disestablishments: Judaic Studies, GWS, LAS, MENAS and Human Rights Practice.

To enhance classroom learning, the Global Studies BA offers a variety of co-curricular and alternative educational experiences, including language study, study abroad, and internships with an international component.

No changes to the workload of current faculty will be made and no additional hires will be made at this time. There may be a shift for certain faculty members with regard to which courses they will teach in the upcoming years. The SGS Undergraduate Studies Committee will work with curricular leads in JUS, MENA, LAS, GWS, and HRTS to create a two-year course rotation to coordinate core courses and shifting faculty teaching assignments. To keep faculty workloads the same, the ability to schedule a particular course in an emphasis in the future may be affected.

A budget of \$42,000 was requested to Arizona Online for online course development funds for new online courses for Core II and the Human Rights and Social Movements emphasis. Other than that, new resources or significant reallocation of resources will not be necessary.

One of the new emphases we are proposing is a "General" Emphasis that would enable students to select from a wide variety of options across different disciplines. Selecting this emphasis would allow a transfer student to smoothly transition into the Global Studies degree.
