<b>Suggested updates</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>-Include the Civic Institutions requirement in both individual and completed General Education curriculum.</li> <li>-Remove detailed language about criteria for specific General Education requirements.</li> <li>-Add option for satisfying a complete General Education curriculum using a complete Associate of Arts or Associate of Science degree.</li> <li>-Update Office of Transfer Credit &amp; Articulation to the Office of the Registrar to reflect current practice.</li> <li>-Update applicability section to allow coursework over 8 years old to apply to General Education and electives, in line with the existing Time Limits policy</li> </ul>		
<b>Rationale for updates</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>-Policy already addresses Exploring Perspectives and Building Connections requirements, but not the new Civic Institutions requirement.</li> <li>-Specific language describing Exploring Perspectives and Building Connections course criteria are duplicative of content that already exists in the General Education Curriculum policy and on the Gen Ed website.</li> <li>-Allowing a completed Associate’s degree to satisfy a complete General Education curriculum simplifies transfer from community colleges to the University.</li> </ul>

The type and number of General Education requirements that are satisfied by transfer courses is dependent on the type of institution and the specific courses taken.</p> <p><b>Transferring a Completed General Education Curriculum</b></p> <p>Students who have an earned Bachelor’s degree from a regionally-accredited institution may transfer a completed General Education curriculum.</p> <p>Students transferring from an Arizona or California community college or state university may transfer a completed General Education curriculum by fulfilling the Arizona General Education Curriculum (AGEC), the Intersegmental General Education Transfer Curriculum (IGETC) or the California State University General Education Pattern (CSU GE) prior to matriculation at the University of Arizona. The requirements to satisfy the AGEC are available through advising centers at Arizona community colleges and state universities; the requirements to satisfy the IGETC and CSU GE are available through advising centers at California community colleges and state universities.</p> <p>The University reserves the right to verify that an AGEC, IGETC, or CSU GE certified by a community college conforms to state-approved policy before the curriculum is applied toward a University of Arizona degree.</p>	<p>Applicability to specific requirements is determined on a course-by-course basis. The type and number of General Education requirements that are satisfied by transfer courses is dependent on the type of institution, <b>credentials earned</b>, and the specific courses taken.</p> <p><b>Transferring a Completed General Education Curriculum</b></p> <p>Students who have an earned Bachelor’s degree, <b>Associate of Arts degree, or Associate of Science degree</b> from a regionally-accredited institution may transfer a completed General Education curriculum.</p> <p>Students transferring from an Arizona or California community college or state university may transfer a completed General Education curriculum by fulfilling the Arizona General Education Curriculum (AGEC), the Intersegmental General Education Transfer Curriculum (IGETC), the California State University General Education Pattern (CSU GE), or <b>the California General Education Transfer Curriculum (Cal-GETC)</b> prior to matriculation at the University of Arizona. The requirements to satisfy the AGEC are available through advising centers at Arizona community colleges and state universities; the requirements to satisfy the IGETC, CSU GE, <b>and Cal-GETC</b> are available through advising centers at California community colleges and state universities.</p>
